







2011 Enrollment Checklist

For 2011, there are many things to consider when selecting your health care plan. Use this helpful checklist to gather the information you need to ensure you and your family get the coverage you need.

Step 1. Know Your Current Plan

Your medical ID card is a good place to look if you're not sure about the information below.

Step 2. Match Your PCPs (from Step 1) to Medical Groups and Networks

If you choose the Performance HMO Plan, you need to determine the network that your PCP's medical group is in. Check your VEBA ID card for medical group name. Remember, the whole family needs to be enrolled in one network but can choose different medical groups within that network.

Step 3. Understand What's Changing in 2011

Unlike before, if you don't make an election during enrollment, you may not get the PCP or the benefits you want.

нмо	Select a network (Network 1, 2, or 3) and PCP in that network (if your current PCP's medical group is not in that network)	You and your covered family members will be automatically enrolled in the Performance HMO plan, Network 1 with a PCP in a medical practice close to your home address.
POS	 Choose a new health plan If you only use "in-network" providers, your costs may be lower and the benefits richer if you enroll in the Performance HMO 	You and your covered family members will be automatically enrolled in Performance HMO, Network 1 with a PCP in a medical practice close to your home address.
PPO	Do nothing, unless you want to choose a new plan or add dependents	You and your covered family members will remain in your district's PPO plan.
Kaiser	Do nothing, unless you want to choose a new plan or add dependents	You and your covered family members will remain in your district's Kaiser plan.

Step 4. Enroll In a Health Plan

	Determine the network in which most of your family's PCPs belong (Step #2)		
	Select Network 1, Network 2 or Network 3		
	 Your network choice is effective for one year, you CANNOT change it unless you have a qualified family status change (birth, adoption, marriage) 		
	 All family members must be in the same network. To make it easier to access pediatric care, Children's Physician Medical Group is included in every network. 		
	Select a PCP		
	 Visit http://www.pacificare.com, click on "Find a Doctor" 		
	 You can search by: Location, Medical Group, Network or Doctor Name 		
	 Family members can have different PCPs as long as they're all in the same network. 		
	Decide if you want to add or delete dependents		
	Confirm your dependents (Step #1)		
	 Remember, in 2011 you can add an eligible dependent to the plan regardless of his/her student status 		
	 Before your dependent is enrolled, you must submit appropriate documentation to your district. Check your benefits office for your district's requirements. 		

- You will receive an enrollment kit that includes all the information you need to enroll in the plan, including an enrollment form and deadline dates. Keep in mind, some districts may offer online enrollment.
- If you are a new employee and are enrolling in a VEBA health plan for the first time, you must complete a paper enrollment form, even if your district offers online enrollment.
