

Enrollment Trends & Considerations


Disparity in enrollment between site/grade levels will require ongoing inter-district transfers to sustain programs/course of study.

CUSD Enrollment Trends (2000-2018)



CUSD Total Enrollment: Low 2,715 (2000-01), High 3,197 (2012-13). IDT %: Low 10% (2000-01), High 17% (2008-09)

Coronado USD: LCFF vs. Basic Aid Districts

LCFF districts are funded based on enrollment and demographics. Districts with high concentrations of low-income, English learners and foster youth receive more money than districts with lower concentrations of these subgroups.

Average LCFF entitlement per ADA (student) ~\$8,174


- LCFF Base Grant ~\$24 Million
- LCFF Supplemental Grant ~\$421 Thousand
- SDUSD receives approximately \$1,500 more per student than CUSD
- CUSD ranks 36th out of 42 in San Diego County for LCFF funding per ADA

Military Connected = Federal Impact Aid

Conservative analysis estimates that CUSD could receive upwards of \$2 million dollars more each year if it were funded based on property taxes (Basic Aid)

Expenditure Summary - General Fund 01

- Employee salaries and benefits account for over 81% of the district's budget (160 certificated, 120 classified, 27 management/ non-represented)
- Employer contributions to employee retirement programs STRS/PERS have doubled since 2013 - over \$3 million/year
- Growth in expenditures are outpacing growth in revenues

Record Grant Support



2004 Site Grants: \$105,000

2010 Site Grants: \$277,177

2014 Site Grant: \$678,429 (Fran Harpst Gift)

- Coronado Schools Foundation has returned \$10M since 1982
- Reached Record Return of \$1M for 2018-19 in 2nd Year of Strategic Plan
- 90% of these funds are fueling teachers and programs
- Your continued support is critical to fuel STEAM programs






