**1. Write a narrative description on how the funds from Proposition 28 have been used to develop and support arts education programs in the school district (2500 character limit)**

Coronado USD (CUSD) is proud of its robust arts education programs which include opportunities for students to explore a wide range of arts education programs which support their unique interests. Arts education has long been a priority within CUSD as we strive to enrich students' artistic experiences, foster creative expression, and provide a well-rounded education.

Elementary School - The elementary school programs provide a strong foundation in arts education, preparing students for further arts study in middle school:

- **Choral and Instrumental Music:** The program includes both choral and instrumental music, fostering early musical skills and appreciation.
- **Visual and Performing Arts:** Expanded offerings now encompass visual art, multimedia arts, and dance/drama, providing a diverse range of artistic experiences.
- **Supplemental Equipment and Supplies:** Various materials and supplies were purchased to enrich student arts experiences.

Middle School - To create a comprehensive arts program, our middle school provides a variety of fine and performing arts in addition to digital media and film.

- **Visual and Performing Arts:** Expanded offerings now encompass visual art, multimedia arts, and dance/drama, providing a diverse range of artistic experiences.
- **Digital Media/Film:** Programming includes Digital Photography, Graphic Design, Video Film, and Digital Art classes, providing students with diverse and modern artistic opportunities.

High School - Our high school arts education program focused on providing opportunities and resources for students to engage in visual and performing arts:

- **Visual and Performing Arts:** Offerings encompass visual art, multimedia arts, and dance/drama, providing a diverse range of artistic experiences.

- Band and Instrumental Music
- Coronado School of the Arts: With a curriculum designed by professional artist/educators, students are immersed in their chosen specialty in one of six conservatories: Classical and Contemporary Dance, Digital Arts (Animation, Filmmaking, Game Design, and Graphic Design), Instrumental Music, Musical Theatre & Drama, Theatre Production, Design & Management and Visual Art. CoSA is a State of California-approved Career Technical Education program.

The district's implementation of the Proposition 28 Arts Education program during the 2024-25 school year has been a great success. These comprehensive programs not only enhance students' educational experiences but also prepare them for lifelong engagement with the arts.
