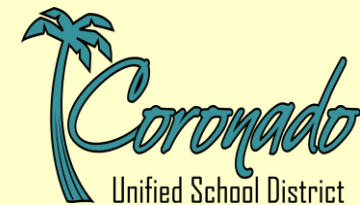

What is Transitional Kindergarten?

Transitional Kindergarten (TK) is a bridge between preschool and kindergarten for children turning 5 years old, typically between September and December. It gives young learners a head start and provides them with an opportunity to learn and grow in an environment that is tailored to meet their academic and social needs.

Transitional Kindergarten:



- Is part of the public school system and is free for families
- Uses a unique, specialized curriculum that is based on the kindergarten standards and is designed to support young 5 year olds
- Is taught by credentialed teachers with specialized training to teach young kindergarteners

Starting school is a very exciting time for children and their families! It begins a new chapter in their lives and sets the tone for children's future. California's kindergarten standards and curriculum have changed over the years and continue to do so with the advent of new standards. Many of the skills children were once taught in first grade are now expected in kindergarten. This can make the transition into kindergarten difficult for some children, and the youngest children entering the kindergarten classroom often struggle to adjust.

The good news is that California passed a law in 2010 to create Transitional Kindergarten, giving children an opportunity to learn in a hands-on, interactive way that supports their development, while still maintaining the rigor and high standards of kindergarten. CUSD has offered TK since 2012-13 with great success. Both Silver Strand and Village Elementary offer transitional kindergarten.

When Ryan first began transitional kindergarten, he had trouble focusing in class and struggled to write many words. After just a few months, Ryan's focus is much better and he is now able to write sentences. "He feels so much more confident now," says his mother, Monica. "Transitional kindergarten was a perfect fit for him."

Who attends traditional kindergarten? Who attends Transitional Kindergarten (TK) for 2020-2021?

A law was passed in California in 2010 to change the age when children can begin traditional kindergarten. **For school year 2020-2021, children must turn 5 years old on or before September 1, 2020 to enroll in traditional kindergarten.** September 1 is the state of California's cut-off date for traditional kindergarten admittance every year. While this change of a few months from the previous cutoff date of December 2 may seem small, it can mean a big difference during these early years when children are rapidly growing and developing.

The same law also created Transitional Kindergarten (TK) so that children who are affected by this change have an opportunity to continue building their skills and abilities. Their time in TK will help them to succeed in kindergarten the following year, become leaders in the classroom and confidently navigate the school day routine. **All children who will have their 5th birthday between September 2 and December 2, 2020 (inclusive) must be admitted to Coronado Unified School District's Transitional Kindergarten for the 2020-2021 school year.**
